“ My name is Barbara Barry Fries. My grandfather was Otto Cheska, and was on the Board of Directors of North Side Bank when Jean was an officer there. When I was a senior in high school he asked her if there was a job for me. She was so nice and hired me to work after school. I walked there and worked from 3 to 5:30 and Fridays til closing and Saturdays till noon in bookkeeping to earn money for college. I worked Summers and Holidays while going to UW Milwaukee and upon graduation, I went to work there full time. Who would have thought I would have stayed there even after Jean retired for a total of 20 years! Jean was always an inspiration to me because she was the first woman to sit on the Board of Directors of a bank in Racine and to hold the title of Senior Vice President. Jean and I, along with several others, had lunch every day across the street at the Paragon Restaurant. I remember coffee was all of 10 cents a cup then. One of my funniest memories was when we were crossing Douglas Avenue to go back to the bank from lunch and the wind blew her wig off. It was like a tumble weed rolling down Douglas Avenue with Jean in her heels running after it. It was amazing she did not get hit by a car! I remember Jean got her real estate license after she retired and i was always intrigued by that..... so much so that I too now am a realtor and have been one for 28 years. One of our bank customers, Chuck Vargo who owned Coldwell Banker hired me. Jean always liked Chuck and was happy that i was working for him. Again, Jean was my role model. I sent Christmas cards to Jean every year but several years ago they started coming back to me. They were not forwarded to her. Someone told me she was at St Monicas and I sent them there, but they also were returned. Nobody told me where she was or I would have visited her.

I am glad Jean is in heaven with her beloved parents! She was a good daughter and took such good care of them both. I am glad she is not living alone anymore. I always enjoyed seeing her at Wells Brothers on Friday nights. When i saw her and her friends, the Fumo girls, she always asked me about my children and my family. When they reopen, I will think of her whenever I am there and i will miss seeing her. Jean..... God Bless You! You were a pioneer for many of us to know that women could be an equal professionally with men in the business world. You will be missed!!!!
