RACINE-Ann Helen (nee: DeLuca) Wiegel, 94, passed away peacefully with her family by her side, on Tuesday, January 22, 2013 at Wheaton Franciscan Health Care-All Saints. She had excellent knitting skills, making sweaters and afghans for family members. She worked part-time at Hamilton Beach and Borden's and Sealtest Ice Cream Co. as one of the original food demonstrators. Most of all, Ann found great enjoyment in spending time with grandchildren, great grandchildren and family members. She was well known for her famous spaghetti dinners, homemade chicken soup and a warm home environment for holiday gatherings.
