David William Finstad, aged 71, passed away on November 12, 2024, at the Medical Suites of Oak Creek. Born on August 1, 1953 in Sioux City, IA, David, affectionately known as Dave, was a cherished member of the community and a beacon of kindness and friendship. He married Dianne Marie Lueke on March 27, 2004 at St. Michael's Episcopal Church, Racine.

Dave's early exposure to aviation through his stepfather, Keith Hansen, ignited a lifelong passion for flying. This passion culminated in the founding of Centurion Aviation Services in Racine, a reputable flight school that continues to help many achieve their dreams of flying. His dedication to aviation was recognized with the prestigious Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award, a testament to his safe flying practices and commitment to the aviation community.

Alongside his aviation career, Dave held various positions in retail truck stop management and manufacturing operations. His genuine ability to connect with people from all walks of life made him a beloved figure in every professional circle he was part of.

Dave's commitment to his faith was profound. He was actively involved in Stand On His Word Ministry, Zion (IL) Healing Rooms, Racine Co. Jail ministry and others in the area. Dave also enjoyed attending healing conferences across the country. When not flying, he dedicated his time to ministering to

and praying for others, embodying the love of Jesus through both his actions and words.

Dave is survived by his wife, Dianne; Dave's children, Katrina (Cory) Huie, Daniel and Danae Finstad; grandchildren, Christian and Damien Wilson, and Bruce Lee Burriell; sister, Julee (Tom) Abrahamson; brother, Kevin (Annelle) Finstad; and other family and friends. He was preceded in death by his father, Neil Finstad, mother, Dorothy (Johns) Hansen, stepfather, Keith Hansen, and stepbrother, David Hansen.

A gathering and service to celebrate Dave's life will be held at Sturino Funeral Home, Thursday, December 5 at 12 noon. Visitation will be held from 10:00 a.m. until time of service.

“ I met Dave when I was 13 years old in 1994 when I started to take flying lessons with him at Sylvania Airport. I had to sit on 2 phone books or a few pillows to see over the instrument panel back then! While my family didn't have a lot of money to pay for frequent lessons, Dave was understanding, patient and the perfect instructor for my situation. After being endorsed to solo, I flew by myself in a Piper Cherokee at Sylvania Airport before I could drive a car.

Dave was almost like a family member back in the 90s even attending my high school graduation party. While I couldn't consistently take lessons to get proficient enough to take my Private Pilot check-ride before I moved away for college, the seed had been planted. I cannot overstate Dave's influence on my life, flying with him in my formative years paved the way for where my life would lead to today.

Because of Dave, one of the most important traditions my family participates in each year began in 1994, attending Airventure (EAA Fly-In Convention back then) he told me and my parents we could get into the flightline just by bringing my logbook and showing them I was a student pilot, he was right!

Because of Dave, I knew that after college I wanted to be a professional pilot. I continued my flight training eventually becoming a certified flight instructor myself and flying corporate for a while. Because of Dave, my passion for aviation has led to a career in aviation and aviation safety that I still enjoy to this day.

After I left college we lost contact and life got in the way as it does, but through a chance meeting when I saw Dave at a FIRC in 2015, I began to keep in touch with him a bit over the next several years. In early 2021 things came full circle when Dave and I flew together for the first time since 1999, when he gave me a flight review out of Racine and I flew with him a few more times over the next couple years. He even got to meet my wife and son before I took them for an airplane ride at Centurion Aviation Services, my son only 4 at the time on his first flight in an airplane.

I'm heartbroken to hear of his passing and wish I could have told him more directly how important he was/is to me, though, when we flew together the last couple years, I think he could tell. I hope he was proud.
