Guy Joseph Rannow 73, resident of Racine, passed away on Sunday, February 28th, 2021. 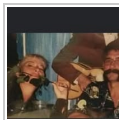

Guy was my roommate during the 1968-69 term at Whitewater, when we both lived at Mrs. Marquardt's home. Guy took care of the cooking and I cleared and washed the dishes. His favorite meal was chicken caccitori, which I had once heard of but never eaten until Guy put the dish in front of me. And it wasn't bad. In fact, it got better the more often he prepared it. Guy was also a wonderfully curious and avid learner. He was fascinated by the Niebelungenlied and eagerly shared his discovery of it with us. We were all smokers in those days, believing the claim that "three out of four doctors" recommended the Micronite filter... And I vividly recall the day Guy found a bent piece of metal in one of his Luckies. He sent it back to the company with a note asking if this was what they meant by LSMFT? A week or so later, he received a carton of Luckies with a note of apology from the company. It was Guy's AMC Javelin that motivated me to go out and buy my first car. Which only gave rise to one of Guy's famous chuckles, since my dream cruiser was a Buick LeSabre. Not exactly the kind of pavements scorcher he fancied. What I remember most, however, was Guy's terrific sense of humor and easy smile. He always had a laugh to share and he brightened not only my days but those of the rest of Mrs. Marquardt's residents as well. If he ever had a bad day, I never knew it. Aside from the pizza we shared at Wells Bros, Guy and I never really had an opportunity to get caught up. No matter, I have a wealth of very good memories to look back upon.

Guy was as good, decent and upright a person as I ever knew. My life is all the better for having known him and for having been able to share his friendship. I am deeply sorry for your loss. Blessings and peace to you and your family.
