Joel Louis Lamke, 90, passed away on Saturday, October 5, 2024, with his wife of 66 years by his side. He was born on July 2, 1934, to Elroy and Florence (nee: Krause) Lamke in Coon Valley, WI. Joel was united in marriage to Patricia Ellen Browe in August 1958.

Joel is a graduate of UW Stout. He was employed by Racine Unified School District as an industrial arts teacher (as he would say, wood butcher/tin bender) at Mitchell School, retiring in 1990 after 33 years. Joel also coached the basketball team and was a drivers-ed instructor. He served in the Army National Guard.

Joel was an avid volunteer in the community. He was always there to help others. He belonged to an extensive list of organizations and was also the first to show up and the last to leave. One of the things Joel was known for was taking all the “junk” as potential treasures to reuse and make the world a better place.

Joel is survived by his wife, Patricia of Racine; son, Thomas (Michelle) Lamke of Caledonia; daughter, Jodi (Gordon) Gladstone of Richmond, CA; grandsons, Gefen and Nitzan Gladstone of Richmond, CA; sisters, Elaine Hanson of Cupertino, CA, and Geraldine Schults of Grove City, OH.

Joel was preceded in death by his parents, Elroy and Florence; brother, Richard; sisters, LaVerne Ness and Vivian Strong.

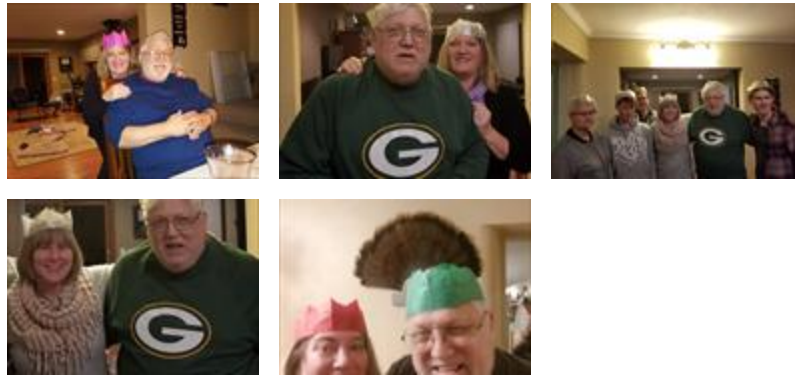
