RACINE – Madeline Meyer Gabert, 100, passed away at Willowgreen, on Monday, August 15, 2011.

Madeline was born in Plainfield, Wisconsin on February 21, 1911, the daughter of Joseph and Minnie (nee: Lauer) Meyer. After graduation from Plainfield High School, Madeline moved to Milwaukee, where she attended and graduated from Brown Business College. She was a supervisor for Milwaukee Telephone Company from 1930 until 1940. On November 16, 1940 Madeline was united in marriage to Lawrence W. 'Doc' Gabert in Milwaukee. Madeline and "Doc" moved to Camp Shelby, Mississippi, for two years, returning to Wisconsin, living in Milwaukee and Elm Grove. In 1972 they retired to Seminole, FL. moving back to Wisconsin in 2004.

She was a member of Elm Grove Women's Club, Elm Grove Garden Club, and an active member and teacher in the National Embroidery Guild. She enjoyed all forms of needlework, including quilting, rug hooking, silk embroidery and needle lace. Madeline was also a volunteer at Elmbrook Memorial Hospital and started St. Mary's Thrift Store in Elm Grove.

Madeline is survived by two daughters, Kathleen (David) Loomans of Seminole, FL and Madelynn (Fred) Fleischmann of Racine; son, Gregory (Amy Griswald) Gabert of Palmetto, FL; three grandchildren, Nichol Feltes, Andrea Martinec and Timothy Einwalter; five great grandchildren, Mason, Austin, Madison, Johnathon and Molly Mae. She is further survived by nieces,

nephews, other relatives and friends.

Madeline was preceded in death by her loving husband, Lawrence 'Doc' Gabert on April 17, 1990; sisters, Leone Detlor and Loretta Hetzel; brothers, Ernie Meyer, Bud Meyer and Roy Meyer.
