RACINE – Marjorie June (nee: Gerber) Matson, 93, passed away on Friday, April 24, 2015 at Harmony Commons.

She was born in Mt. Pleasant on July 1, 1921, the daughter of George and Bertha (nee: Kanetzke) Gerber. Marjorie graduated from William Horlick High School in January 1939. On November 4, 1944, she was united in marriage to Edward C. Matson, by Rev. Theodore Volkert. She was a lifetime member of First Evangelical Lutheran Church, the Ladies Aid and also had been a Sunday school teacher. Marjorie's working career began at Western Publishing, then J. C. Penney's and Matson Grocery Store. In 1972 after Ed's retirement they moved to St. Germain. While living in St. Germain, Ed built "The Little Haus" for Marjorie, where she had a gift shop and worked with beading, jewelry making and needlepoint.

Surviving are sisters-in-law, Joyce Gerber and Mary Gerber. She is further survived by nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

Marjorie was preceded in death by her husband, Ed on December 30, 2006; brothers, Robert and Ralph; sister, Marion Dygon.

Funeral services will be held at Sturino Funeral Home on Tuesday, April 28, 2015 at 11 a.m. There will be a visitation the funeral home on Tuesday from 10 a.m. until time of service at 11 a.m. Marjorie will be laid to rest in Graceland Cemetery.
