With heavy hearts, we announce the passing of Michael Jack Molbeck, age 67, due to multiple health complications. Michael was born in Racine, WI on November 6, 1957, and left us on December 13, 2024, leaving behind both a life well lived and one left too soon.

Michael graduated from Horlick High School in 1975 and enrolled in classes at UW Parkside. He left college for a bigger calling and proudly served in the U.S. Army 5th Special Forces, known as the Green Berets and was stationed at Fort Bragg in North Carolina. He completed jump school and recorded 153 jumps on his resume from C130s to other aircraft. His military experience provided personal growth and sparked his love for exploration and wanderlust.
