RACINE - Ronald J. Konicek, 86, went home to be with his Lord on Tuesday, October 20, 2015 at Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare-Franklin. On August 15, 1929, Ron was born in Racine to the late Joseph and Linda (nee: Gildemeister) Konicek. He attended Racine Lutheran High School where he met his future wife Hannelore Adele Schiemann. They were married in 1952 and celebrated 59 years together. She preceded him in death on September 19, 2011.

Ron entered the U. S. Marine Corps after high school where he fought in the Korean War, including the battle of the Chosin Reservoir. After leaving the Marines, he joined the Racine Police Department where he became a Detective. In the late 1960's he left the police department to start his own successful business, Americana Antiques. He was a lifelong Packer Fan. Ron is survived by his children, Tim (Annette) Konicek, Craig (Jaclyn) Konicek and Robert (Barbara) Konicek; four grandchildren, Katia, Sarah, Samantha and Alison and a great granddaughter, Elsie. He is further survived by sisters, Nancy Hougard and Susan Brown and a brother Joel Konicek, other relatives and friends.

Memorial services will be held at Grace Lutheran Church, 3700 Washington Ave. on Monday, October 26, 2015 at 11 a.m. with Rev. Randal Poppe officiating. Ron will be laid to rest next to his wife, Honey at West Lawn Memorial Park following services. There will be a visitation at the church
