Rose M. Glines (Matern), 92, died on Saturday, September 24, 2011. Born to John and Susanna (Kracher) Matern in Racine WI on November 3, 1918, Rose grew up and spent much of her life in Racine, graduating from William Horlick High School in 1937. She married Clair Guy (Bud) Glines on June 1, 1940, and they raised six children. Rose and Clair were unselfishly dedicated to others and respected and encouraged the unique qualities of each of their children. Rose was not only a kind counselor and comforter but also a tireless supporter of her children's outside activities in the community. In retirement she and Clair built a house in Door County WI where they spent many happy years. In 2004 they moved to the Three Pillars retirement community in Dousman, WI and joined St. Mary's Episcopal Church.

Rose will be lovingly remembered by all who knew her. Her first important relationship began even before she was born, with her twin sister Freda. They remained in almost daily communication until Freda's death in 2007.
