He was always loving to his cats, and he had many things to keep the cats as happy as possible. He would always let me use his stuff, even though he knew I could break some of his favorite things. I always sent him cards with drawings that he would hang up and look at constantly. He was truly a great man.

Tom is survived by his son, Nick, (Johanna); grandson, Nolan; siblings, Virginia, Jacob, and Glen (Jeanette) Urick. He is further survived by nieces, nephews, other relatives, and friends.
